

About the Conference

A growing population and growing economy are creating a competition on the scarce water resources of Afghanistan. For example, today's drinking water supply in Kabul is only based on ground water. However, due to increasing water consumption and inadequate waste water disposal, overexploitation and pollution of local aquifers are already affecting the quality and quantity of the groundwater in the Kabul basin, as comprehensive hydrogeological surveys carried out in 2003/04 indicate. Further more, a lack of specific national policies and strategies hindering proper response to the growing needs of the Afghan communities.

Formulation of policies and strategies for improvements in the management and protection of the water resources in general and for the Kabul basin in particular, as well as improving water services through an independent, autonomous water service provider with a sound water supply infrastructure are therefore of vital interest to ensure the future supply with hygienically sound drinking water, especially to the inhabitants of Kabul.

The conference will focus on results from the Afghan-German Cooperation in the water sector, especially from the cooperation of:

- Ministry of Mines and Industry with BGR on the groundwater survey in Kabul:
- Ministry of Energy and Water with GTZ in the formulation of water resources management policies;
- Ministry of Urban Development and Housing with KfW, GTZ and DED in water supply infrastructure and institutional setup in Kabul, Herat and Kunduz.

Further on, options for awareness building on new water policies and for improving groundwater protection will be presented and discussed.

The conference will take place at the Hotel Inter Continental, Kabul. National and international experts and decision makers from relevant Afghan authorities are invited to participate. Also industries related to the water sector are invited to exhibit services and products.
